I literally saw our Vision Statement come alive. I saw 'A Vibrant Adventist youth movement, living their hope in Jesus and transforming Navesau'. systems, and the culture of the entire community.

Yeast has a purpose to fulfill while interacting with the dough. Likewise we also have a purpose of living out the values of the Kingdom of Jesus Christ as we interact with people, institutions, and communities wherever we are placed.

By the power of the Holy Spirit, we can have an amazing influence to TRANSFORM our surroundings for the glory of God. Are you a Transformer for the Lord?



Faithfulness In Tithes & Offerings


In Malachi 3:10 (NIV), the Lord says to "Bring the whole tithe into the storehouse, that there may be food in my house. Test me in this,' says the LORD Almighty, 'and see if I will not throw open the floodgates of heaven and pour out so much blessing that there will not be room enough to store it."

The Lord asks each of us to return a faithful tithe and offering, and when we do, He blesses us. The positive results of tithes and offerings in our Union is testament to this promise by God. It then becomes the responsibility of those of us as treasurers. deacons, elders and leaders in all levels of our organisation to demonstrate a faithful stewardship of the blessings God has given us to support His work.

Recent report from our world church (GC) shows that world mission offerings went down by 18% in 2020 and tithe fell 11% for all other divisions as a group except for NAD and SPD with increases of 1.7% and 2.33% respectively. We praise God for this result in our area despite the economic downturn caused by Covid-19 pandemic.

We express our gratitude to God for His provisions in the last five years with the steady growth in tithes and offerings in our Union.

When Covid-19 hit us in 2020, we anticipated our tithes and offerings to fall as churches temporarily closed and economic activities disrupted.

We pondered how the finances of our missions and entities would manage. Initial results in the first and second quarters of last year had already showed a drop in tithes and offerings for some of our larger missions which was expected.

In our Union, over the past five years, the annual tithe has increase 21.2%, growing from \$17.27 million in 2016 to \$20.94 million in 2020. Total Union-wide planned giving offerings also saw an increase over the guinguennium, increasing 18.6%, from \$5.53 million in 2016 to \$6.56 million in 2020.



However, we praise God for our members' faith-

fulness that tithes and offerings have bounced back close to annual budget levels by the end of 2020 for some of our Missions.

American Samoa had the biggest increase in tithe with 43.9%, which is quite an achievement for an Attached Region that just became a new separate Mission at end of 2020. Fiji Mission (5.06%), Samoa Mission (18.66%) and Tonga Mission (9.64%) also have increases in tithes in 2020. On the other hand,



Solomon Mission (-19.18%), Vanuatu Mission (-3.85%) and Kiribati Mission (-28.48%) had drop in tithes in 2020. We anticipate tithes and offerings

will slowly pick up again this year onwards as countries start to recover from the economic effects of Covid-19.

Overall, our comparative year-to-date combined tithe fell by 1.91% from 2019, which is a very good result, better than what we anticipated.

Again, we praise God for our members' faithfulness in tithes and offerings despite the challenges they go through, in supporting God's work and mission.

Lastly, we would like to express our gratitude and thanks to our faithful treasurers, deacons, elders and church leaders for combined efforts in ensuring tithes and offerings reach the storehouse. To God be the glory!

In Preparation of HIS COMING

As we move towards the close of earth's history, we look forward to the second coming of Jesus. We look forward to that day when there will be no sickness, sorrow or death. God has given us help and direction in His Holy Word, to prepare us for life eternal. We as a church, have been given the Health Message recorded and written by God's inspired messenger Ellen G. White. The Adventist Health message is very relevant in time and age. Evidence-based practical and wholistic healthy lifestyle behaviours can protect us from many lifestyle diseases like diabetes, hypertension and infectious diseases caused by various viruses and bacteria.

With the current pandemic we face now, there are many issues and confusion that may arise in our local churches. We would like to clear this as much as possible and help our members live abundant lives. Here are a few statements from the General Conference Department of Health Ministries, General Conference Biblical Research Institute, and Loma Linda University School of Pharmacy and School of Public Health to help our understanding. "Adventist Health Ministries is firmly based on the Bible, the instruction of the Spirit of Prophecy through Ellen White, and is in line with peer-reviewed, evidence-based health science. We rely on these foundations in formulating health approaches and advice.

With millions infected, and many dead, and global infections on the increase, a number of vaccines have been developed in record time. There are many questions people are asking regarding the COVID-19 vaccine. As a church, while we support evidence-based public health recommendations, we are also careful not to make statements that may be seen as replacing national and international public health guidelines.

For this reason, it is important for our comments to be understood within the framework of our official church position on immunization. "The Seventh-day Adventist Church places strong emphasis on health and well-being. The Adventist health emphasis is based on biblical revelation, the inspired writing of E. G. White (co-founder of the Church), and on peer-reviewed scientific literature.

As such, we encourage responsible immunization/vaccination, and have no religious or faith-based reason not to encourage our members to responsibly participate in protective and preventive immunization programs. We value the health and safety of the population, which includes the maintenance of 'herd immunity.' "The church cannot control a personal choice. These are exercised by the individual. The choice not to be immunized is not and should not be seen as the dogma nor the doctrine of the Seventh-day Adventist Church."

It is my deepest desire that our church members take the time to read the counsels on health from the spirit of prophecy. Some of the books that we would like to recommend to help you understand the Adventist Health Message are Counsels on Diet and Food, Ministry of Healing, Counsels on Health, Health Food Ministry, Medical Ministry, and Healthful Living & Temperance. These books can be downloaded on your mobile device or tablets for free from the EGW Writings app or you can buy yourself a copy from the Adventist Hope Book Store.

For concerns regarding the vaccines, talk to your local health professional to explain to you or clear your concerns with regards to the vaccine. It is my earnest hope and prayer that through the help of the Holy Spirit we continue to keep our eyes on Jesus and continue to participate in fulfilling the Gospel Commission by answering to the call in the affirmative, "I Will Go".
